As part of our inheritance and evolution unit we extracted DNA from kiwi fruit and made models of DNA.






























Duke of Edinburgh

Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh students prepared for their expedition and camp by completing an eight mile walk across the Humber Bridge and around Barton.














IPASS Presentation






Year 10 Work Experience

Sirius Academy West 34 Castleford Academy 14

The Sirius Academy West Year 10 boys managed to win their first major trophy, as they beat Castleford Academy in the Yorkshire Cup final by a convincing 34 - 14 scoreline. This is the first time ever that Castleford have been beaten, and it was a well deserved victory from our boys, with an outstanding team performance.

Sirius started the game strong, as Castleford could not break their defensive line. With ball in hand Sirius were making easy yards forward as Jake F and Noah B were too hard to handle. Sirius broke the deadlock early on, when a pin point high kick from Jacob L saw Ollie B leap above their fullback, take the ball and dive over, Ronnie H converted for 6 - 0. Bosco M and Ronnie H were working overtime in attack, and Isaac L was making good yards from intelligent scoots, as Sirius continued to pile on the pressure and put themselves in good field position. Up stepped the talented Jacob L on the last, for another outstanding high kick to the corner, and once again it was Ollie B that jumped the highest and went over in the corner for his second of the match. Ronnie H kicked a superb conversion from the left edge to make it 12 - 0. Castleford got one back after some slack marker play from Sirius. But right on the halftime whistle, a fine ball to Ashdon O saw him use pure strength and determination to get the ball over in the corner. The boot of Ronnie H was unreal, as he slotted one over from the right edge, to make the halftime score 18 - 6.

The second half started well for Sirius as they went over for an early try, a little chip over on the last from Jacob L saw him follow it up and touchdown himself, a fine individual try from our skilful halfback, 22 - 6. Fair play to Castleford, they fought back with a couple of tries of their ow to make it 22 - 14, with the next score being all important. They seemed to have the momentum, and a try saving tackle from Clinton T and also debutant Leo A prevented Castleford from going over again. Sirius managed to settle things down and get the ball back in hand after a few tough defensive sets. Once again, they looked so dangerous in attack, and when a fine ball from Jacob L found Malachy O'D in space for him to go over, it looked like finally Sirius would be victorious against the current National Champions. Another outstanding touchline conversion from Ronnie H to make it 28 - 14. Castleford did everything they could to get back in the game, but Freddie F and Issac L were defending well to ensure they didn't go over again. It was Sirius who rounded off the scoring with another strong run from Ashdon O, as there was no stopping him, as the powerful forward managed to get the ball down to make it 34 - 14. The final whistle went and Sirius celebrating, knowing that they fully deserved to lift the Yorkshire Cup for the first time. They will face Castleford Academy again in the National Cup Final on 2nd July at Wakefield RLFC, 7:45pm KO where they will hopefully make it the double!
