Attendance

As the Secretary of State for Education has made clear, young people regularly attending school is a national priority and it is important for their education, well-being, and long-term development. Attendance continues to be mandatory for all students and children should be in school.

The link between regular attendance and outcomes is clear. Students that sat their GCSEs last summer, and had attendance of over 92%, recorded outcomes more than one and a half grades higher in all subjects, when compared to students with attendance below 92%.

Types of Absence

Absence will be recorded as either authorised or unauthorised. This decision will be made based on the reason for absence provided, patterns of absence and historical absence.

Unauthorised Absence

Unauthorised absence can lead to potential Fixed Penalty Notices, prosecutions and fines. The academy will inform all parents at the end of each day if the absence has been unauthorised.

Reasons for logging unauthorised absence can include:

- No reason provided by parent or carer
- Doubt in the reason provided based on historical absence
- Holidays (including extended weekends resulting in Friday or Monday absence)
- Parent/Carer/Sibling illness
- Current attendance below 90%

Persistent Absence

Students with attendance below 90% are classed as Persistent Absentees by the Department for Education (DfE). Students that are below 90% will face increased monitoring, including more Home School Liaison Officer visits, calls from the Attendance Team and offers of bespoke meetings to identify strategies to improve.

Maximising Attendance

Parents and carers can support their child in maximising their attendance at the academy by following the guidance below. It is vital that attendance becomes a habit. This can include building a routine at home in the morning and evening, showing an awareness of your child's current attendance and absence patterns, avoiding medical appointments during the academy day and contacting the academy for support should you face challenges with encouraging your child to attend.

Absence Protocol

If your son or daughter is ill or absence is unavoidable, we ask that you contact the Academy between 8.00am and 9.00am on the first morning of your son/daughter's absence.

The Attendance Team can be contacted by telephone on 01482 975555.

If parents/carers do not contact the Academy to notify us of an absence, a visit from the Home Academy Liaison Officer may be made on that, or subsequent days, to gather information regarding the reason for the absence.

ICT Facilities

Use of the Academy's ICT Facilities

Various projects have proven the educational benefits of internet and email access which enable students to explore a wide range of information sources and communicate and collaborate with other learners throughout the world.

As part of the Academy's Information and Communications Technology (ICT) programme, students are provided with an individual email address and we offer students supervised access to the internet and email.

To prevent students gaining access to material which may be obscene, offensive, illegal or defamatory and to prevent them coming into contact with dangerous or dishonest individuals in chat rooms, students are protected by a filter on incoming web pages and are only allowed to use the internet under adult supervision.

However, the nature of the internet means it is impossible to completely eliminate the risk of students finding unsuitable material or visiting unsuitable websites and we expect students to follow the Academy's Rules for Responsible ICT use in order to maximise their safety.

The Academy uses an electronic "firewall" to control access to the internet. This means that students are unable to access inappropriate websites.

All students sign an agreement that clearly sets out the Academy's expectations of computer users. Students learn about the potential dangers of the internet, email, chat rooms, and social networking sites like Facebook. They also learn what cyber-bullying is and how to deal with it. The Academy aims to make all its students responsible and safe users of ICT.

ICT Use

Rules for Acceptable ICT use

Students may only use the internet if permission has been granted by a teacher or supervising adult.

Students are responsible for their own behaviour on the internet, the material they access and the language they use in any correspondence.

Students are not permitted to play games on the Academy's ICT system unless they are specific educational games.

When using the internet, students must not deliberately look for offensive or inappropriate material. Students encountering such material must report it to a teacher or responsible adult immediately.

Students must not, under any circumstances, enter chat rooms or access external social networking sites.

Students may only use email when asked to do so by a teacher or supervising adult.

Students using email must not use rude or abusive language and may only contact people that have been approved by a teacher or supervising adult.

Students may only use the Academy's ICT systems to complete work.

Students must not attempt to load their own software onto any Academy computer.

Personal printing is not allowed without permission.

Students must not, under any circumstances, give their personal details to anyone they meet on the internet.

Students must not, under any circumstances, arrange to meet, correspond with or exchange text messages with anyone they have encountered over the internet.

The Academy may monitor students' use of ICT facilities, intercept email and check on internet sites visited by students.

Parental Engagement

MyEd Parental Engagement App

Our main source of communication is our Academy MyEd app. We use this tool to:

- Share daily information through direct messages
- Send letters/consent forms which can be returned via the app
- Give parents/carers access to behaviour data
- Send a weekly parental bulletin, #ThisWeekatSAW to share rewards
- Allow parents/carers to contact the Academy direct to report student absence or ask for contact from a member of staff

To download the app, type 'MyEd' into your devices App store. Parents/carers who are registered as Priority 1 on our system will be able to view student details and personal information such as behaviour data (students can have joint Priority 1 parents/carers to allow both to access).

Year Teams

Our Year Teams are responsible for the pastoral well-being of our students. Parents/carers have a direct email address which goes straight through to the Head of Year and Assistant Head of Year.

Student Planners

All students are given a Student Planner which they are responsible for. This Planner allows parents/carers to:

- View all tasks that should be completed at home as students should write these in their Planner
- View a weekly review of student 'Attitude to Learning'
- View all RESPECT reward stamps collected by the student throughout a week
- Parents/carers can include direct notes to staff to communicate messages
